



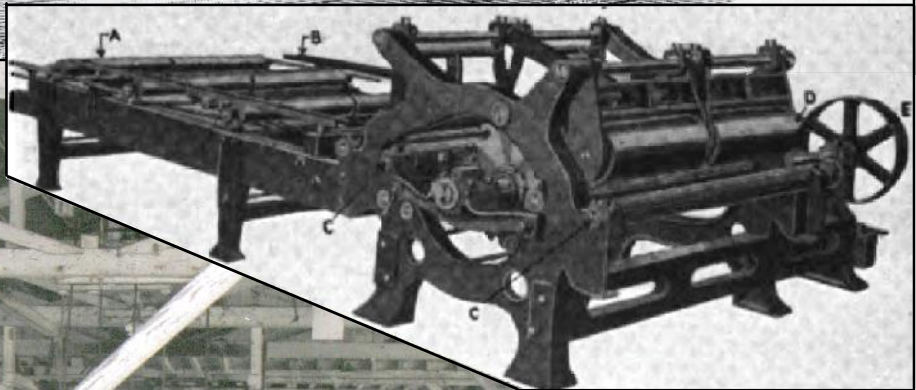
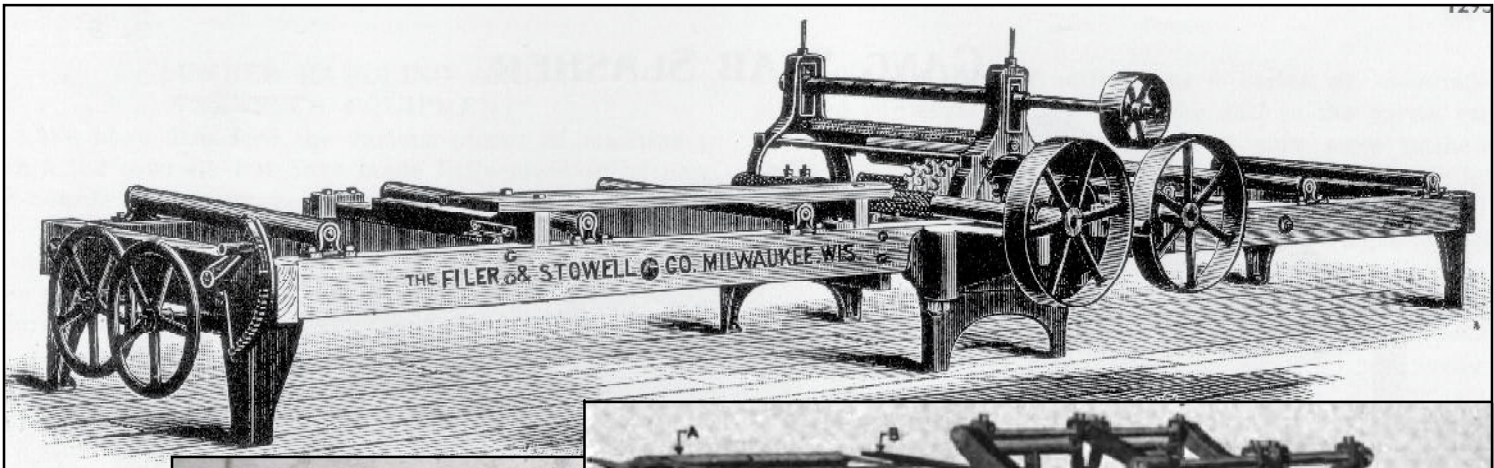
Edger Saw

K Edger

The primary purpose of the edger is to produce boards with parallel sides of standard widths and to remove the rounded edges of boards that come from the Head Saw cants. An important secondary purpose is to divide wide boards into two or more desirable width boards. The third function is to separate clear or valuable sections from knotty or otherwise low grade boards.

The Edger has a front feed table of Dead Rollers and a saw blade adjusting device. A central framework carrying the arbor and circular saws, feed rolls, press rolls, driven pulleys, side guides. To the rear would be Live Rolls which carried boards away from the rear of the saws.

The circular saw blades were adjusted by the Edger Man with levers or wheels at the front of the machine.
